You are invited to participate in a weekend of presentations, round tables, reflective workshops and Welsh-themed social and cultural events. We will explore a variety of questions, thereby drawing out a range of policy, practice and values-based dynamics:

- Do politics matter; what of the differences in youth social policy under the devolved Welsh Assembly Government and Scottish Parliament - have these translated into benefits for young people and those that work with them?
- Do differing organisational and funding strategies make a difference; how about partnership working, can we learn from different approaches?
- Are attitudes to young people different? What of their experience of public space? Perceptions of anti-social behaviour and 'Troubled Families' also seem different - how have these affected practice?
- Meeting expectations (of managers, funders, the community) and national administrations. How can we best evaluate and evidence impact and outcomes?
- What of new media, might they bring us closer together and help both young people and workers learn from each other?
