We are pleased to offer the opportunity for teachers and practitioners working in co-operative schools and those associated with the Co-operative College to undertake a bespoke programme leading to a Post Graduate award in Educational Leadership & Management.

The programme is situated within the framework of co-operative values whilst maintaining a critical approach to the key themes of leadership and management.

The programme offers you the chance to engage in the techniques, concepts and values of leadership, in ways tailored to suit your professional circumstances and interests. Teaching sessions are highly interactive and encourage you to debate and consider a variety of issues from several perspectives. Blended delivery techniques are used, such as taught sessions, tutor support, student networking and a virtual learning environment.

The Post Graduate Certificate is made up of 2 x 30 credit units at Masters level – a descriptor of each unit is shown below.

## Leading Change in Learning Organisations

This unit is designed to engage participants in reflections around the meaning, role and purposes of learning organisations, the ways in which change can be managed, how change can be led in the light of the organisational purposes and develop knowledge about change management and the role that passion and emotion should play in leading learning organisations.

University teaching will be led by Dr Linda Hammersley-Fletcher, an active researcher in the field of school leadership and management. She is working with the Co-operative College team and other university practitioners to develop the programme.

Full details of the programme including dates and costs will be provided through the Co-operative College.

## Investigating Co-operatives, Values and Education

This unit provides an introduction to co-operative identity and will enable participants to develop their personal perspective in relation to its values and practices. It will challenge participants to investigate how co-operative values are articulated in school ethos, policy and practice and to evaluate a community based learning project in the context of these values.



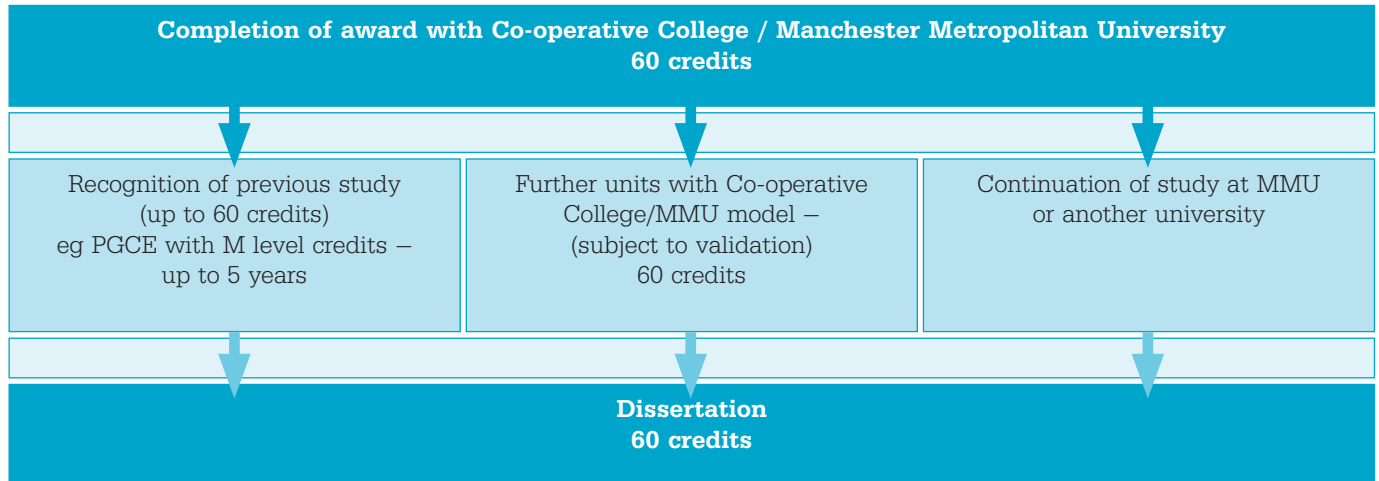
